The first three months of my tenure as President has been a very fulfilling experience.

This year has just flown by as Christmas is almost upon us together with the New Year. We have had an exciting year in Nairne and the districts with a number of events and achievements. We have seen Stage 1 of the Nairne Main Street development completed recently with the following stages to begin next year.

Work has begun on the Chapmans site and demolition had been progressing quite well until workers uncovered a hidden problem. The Nairne Armistice Centenary Mural

Unveiled 10th November 2018

Our Mural consists of 6 Panels in all which oversee and wrap around our flag poles and Cenotaph / Memorial.

The bottom Centre Panel **(a)** depicts the emblems of our three Service Arms, Navy, Army and Air Force.

The Panel **(b)** is the image of a WW1 digger at 'rest on arms reversed' in remembrance of his fallen comrades.

To the right on Panel **(c)** is a 'modern' digger at 'rest on arms reversed' in memory of those lost in all conflicts.

The extreme left panel **(d)** records the Signing of Armistice 11 November 1918 and the cessation of hostilities. In the centre is the Flanders Poppy of remembrance. At the extreme bottom the logos recognise the Nairne Red Cross, our panel designer and fabricator AB-CNC and the Lions Club of Nairne in recognition of their support to the Nairne Community.

The extreme right-hand Panel **(e)** recognises the Centenary of Armistice again with the Poppy of Remembrance in the centre. Then below that the Logos of Dept of Veterans' Affairs, The RSL and Mount Barker District Council in recognition of their support for this Mural.


The sixth panel is on top **(f)**. That is the Australian Rising Sun Emblem of Services and underneath those famous words from the poem written by Robert Laurence Binyon in 1914.

'We Will Remember Them' and complimenting the words on the memorial, 'Lest We forget'.

The Rising sun will be seen from the road above the Memorial and will be backlit at night.

The Mural now forms part of our Cenotaph / Memorial for Nairne.

Although it commemorates the Centenary of Armistice for WW1, dubbed 'the war to end all wars' the Mural honours not just those who did not come home then but all of our service men and women who have served their country in times of conflict right up to the present day.

Our new Armistice Centenary Mural was unveiled by Mayor Ann Ferguson and Federal MP Rebecca Sharkie at 6 pm on the 10th November.

The ceremony was attended by approximately 200 people.

The Mural was in planning for over two years and designed and cut by Local CNC fabricator Adrian Richards (AB CNC) from a concept developed by the Nairne RSL.

Sunday 11th Remembrance Day, the Centenary of the WW1 Armistice saw commenced with a parade down the main street by a contingent of the Barossa Light Horse Historical Group.

This was followed by a short service of respect for the service of Animals. The main Remembrance Day Service followed with a reading of the names of those who did not return from WW1 by Nairne Primary students. Wreaths were laid.

The Nairne Lions provided a sausage sizzle lunch and the NDRA put on a fabulous display of Armistice period photos and memorabilia at the Institute Museum Whilst the Light Horse Group set a a Bell Tent encampment display of the period. Over 300 attended.



The Nairne and District Residents' Association (NDRA) is a group of volunteer people interested in the social, cultural and economic development of Nairne.

We work with the Mount Barker District Council, the Government, our elected representatives and other stakeholders to represent and advocate the views of the community on matters that affect our prosperity and lifestyle. We believe that collaboration and advocacy are the keys to good outcomes for all parties. We exist to hold Council, Government and other stakeholders to account on their commitment to Nairne, but we aim to do this in a culture of respect, rather than one that is adversarial and confrontational.

Our recent work saw the successful passage of the Nairne & Environs Development Plan Amendment (DPA), which defines the key blueprint for the future of the area and the Main Street redevelopment, which when complete at the end of 2021 will completely transform our town centre.

Four times a year, at the start of each season, we publish Nairne & District News, which is a significant community newsletter that includes reports, news and advertising relevant to the local community. Nairne & District News is compiled by volunteers and funded by advertising and a small cover charge. Copies are available from most Main Street businesses, selected locations in the district and by email.

We also run events such as a Family Film Night, Carols by the Lake and Nairne History Festival. We promote heritage and culture by supporting the Nairne heritage trail, the interpretive plaques and the Nairne Museum. Our website nairne.org.au has comprehensive information about our history and access to various resources and contacts to assist and support the community.

The NDRA Facebook Page provides authoritative, factual and accurate information about what is happening in the community within the context of our objectives. Similarly, we are committed to quickly responding to questions and other enquiries so that we can empower residents and prevent the dissemination of misinformation.

Free Breast Cancer Screening in Mount Barker

BreastScreen SA's mobile screening unit is visiting Mount Barker to provide free breast cancer screening (breast X-rays) for more than 3,100 local women.

Screening appointments will commence in late July and will continue until mid-December 2018, with the mobile screening unit located in the car park at Summit Health Care, 85 Wellington Road, Mount Barker.

BreastScreen SA Promotions and Education Manager, Karen Woodcock, said the two biggest risk factors for breast cancer are being a woman and being over 50. "Further, nine out of 10 women who get breast cancer have no family history of this disease," Ms Woodcock said.

"While breast cancer cannot be prevented, the best way to detect it early is by having a screening mammogram every two years. Screening mammograms can detect most breast cancers, including some too small to be felt."

The earlier a breast cancer is found, the more chance a woman has of successful treatment.

"At BreastScreen SA, each woman's X-rays are read by two, independent radiologists and the results are posted within 14 days," Ms Woodcock said.

"Most women are then reassured that their mammogram shows no evidence of breast cancer."

"One breast screen is not enough to last a lifetime. It takes just 10 minutes, and it could save your life," said Ms Woodcock.

"If you're a woman aged 50 to 74, have a breast screen every two years on the mobile screening unit while it's visiting Mount Barker."

Holiday Pets

With Christmas almost upon us we thought we'd help guide you through some common holiday pet perils. The big day itself is full of surprises, with kids waking far too early to uncover Santa's goodies. Plastic wrapping, ribbons and small toys will interest some of the less selective tastes out there and can cause intestinal blockages – sometimes taking days to manifest symptoms after bouncing around in the stomach. Vomiting is the most common sign there's an issue, especially for any longer than a couple of hours. Sometimes a partial blockage can have intermittent signs along with normal or loose faeces. A phone call to discuss your pet's symptoms with the clinic is recommended before serious complications occur.

Grandma's famous Christmas lunch is our next potential risk. The wafting aromas of glazed ham, roast meats and veggies is enough to set any salivary gland into action. Most of our pets can tolerate small amounts of rich foods but when three uncles, two aunties and six grandkids have all given them a 'small' treat, it will overcome even the most robust intestinal system.

Gastroenteritis – inflammation of the intestinal tract causing vomiting, flatulence and diarrhoea – is most common but a more serious disease known as pancreatitis can be fatal. This common condition starts with vomiting and abdominal pain but can lead to multi organ failure without treatment. We should avoid giving cooked bones to pets as they have significant risks of splintering.

Travel between Christmas and New Years Eve is common and we're often asked about sedation for pets. For a lot of pets sedation can be unpredictable and even reduce their ability to regulate their temperature. A few simple steps can help to reduce your pet's anxieties if you're on the move. Most important is to establish a comfortable, confined space for your pet within the vehicle. This can be with a seatbelt attachment or crate but a few short training sessions should be undertaken first.

Simple feeding treats or meals within this new area will positively reinforce your pet prior to travel. Some owner's clothing or familiar toys are also great calming tools. By reducing your pet's sensitivity to things that trigger anxiety we can help prevent a full-blown anxiety attack. In some circumstances medications can be used too, along with training aids, but a consult and physical exam are required in these cases.

Nairne Vet will be closed on the public holidays, referring all emergencies to the 24-hour Animal Emergency Centre in Magill (81320533). Alternative facilities AAERC (Kurrulta Park) and Companion Animal Health Centre (Gawler) are also staffed 24 hours a day for your sick pets.

The fire danger season is upon us again. Fires caused by deliberate, reckless or negligent behaviour not only destroy communities and properties but have the potential to kill. South Australia Police is committed to identifying and apprehending people who deliberately light fires or engage in reckless or negligent fire lighting behaviour. Know your responsibilities, take positive action and report suspicious behaviour to police.

To help keep your property safe from fire, consider implementing these crime prevention tips:

RURAL FIRE PREVENTION

- Erect fences and gates to identify your property boundaries – indicating private property.
- Immediately repair or replace any damaged sections of fencing or gates.
- Ensure security and warning notices are visible to people entering your property.
- Keep fertilisers and other chemicals in a secure location.
- Store petrol, diesel or other flammable fuels in secure areas and locked away when not in use.
- Inspect your property regularly to ensure rubbish, including glass bottles, are disposed of immediately.
- Remove hay from fields as soon as possible

- after harvesting and store it away from fuels, flammable goods and homes.
- Be aware of any restrictions when using incinerators, BBQ's, welding or cutting equipment or farm machinery during the Fire Danger Season and on Total Fire Ban days.

HOME AND BUSINESS FIRE PREVENTION

- Lock your property and vehicle at all times.
- Keep rubbish bins in a secure area and remove rubbish regularly.
- Secure all combustible materials and flammable fuels away from your property.
- External doors should have minimal gaps to prevent papers and flammable items being pushed inside the property.
- Maintain vegetation around your property and remove plant debris.
- Maintain fencing and install external security lighting.
- Conduct regular inspections outside your property. Repair damage to fences and remove graffiti regularly.
- Be aware of any restrictions when using incinerators, BBQ's, welding or cutting equipment or farm machinery during the Fire Danger Season and on Total Fire Ban days.

Keep a note pad in the car and record helpful details including:

location of the suspicious activity i.e. Rural Property Address number and property name, road name, or identifying landmarks vehicle details i.e. registration number, make, model, colour and any distinguishing features (e.g. dents, stickers) characteristics of anyone acting suspicious i.e. age, gender, weight, height, hair colour and clothing.

If you see a fire, immediately call Triple Zero (000). If you see anything suspicious immediately call the Police Assistance line on 131 444.

If you have any information about who is deliberately lighting fires or engaging in reckless or negligent fire lighting behaviour contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 or online at www.sa.crimestoppers.com.au. You can remain anonymous.

Let's work together to prevent the devastation of bushfire this season.



The weekend that Nairne commemorated the Centenary of the signing of the Armistice at the end of World War 1 will be remembered for a long time. It was a moving tribute to that significant event and the sacrifices made by our defence forces and their loved ones both past and present. It was also a celebration of what can be achieved by a small community when there is a common vision.

The new Armistice Centenary Mural behind the Nairne Cenotaph was unveiled on Saturday 10th November by Mayor Ann Ferguson & Rebekah Sharkey MP. I urge everyone who hasn't already done so to have a close look at it. It is a very impressive structure and is a testament to the creativity and technical expertise required to produce it. Not only does it recognise the Armistice and the ongoing contribution of the men & women of the armed forces it also acknowledges the contributions that made the mural possible and local organisations that work closely with the RSL. As members of the Australian Red Cross we are proud to have our insignia on one of the panels.

On Sunday the 11th November the commemorations continued with a procession by the Barossa Light Horse, a Catafalque party, a service of Remembrance to War Service Animals, the Remembrance Day Service, wreath laying and Nairne Primary School students reading out the names, ages and professions of local WW1 Diggers who were killed in action. It was all quite stirring stuff.

After the formalities it was time to have a catch up, enjoy a Lions sausage sizzle and check out the impressive display organised by the Nairne Museum and the replica tent set up the Light Horse.

On another but related issue I would like to remind everyone about a great resource available online from the South Australian Red Cross Information Bureau at www.slsa.sa.gov.au/saredcrossww1. From 1916 until 1919 the Bureau researched 8,033 enquiries from family and friends of missing Australian Imperial Force personnel who fought in WW1. An envelope was created for each enquiry containing:

- information about each soldier enquired upon
- letters from the requesting family
- eyewitness statements about the soldier's last known movements
- and, in most cases, the resulting information on the fate of the soldier, expressed to the survivor.

The packets of information have all been digitised and are available for download. They offer a real insight into the anguish that families suffered during the conflict and frank eyewitness accounts of the reality of war.

On a lighter note I would like to invite you all to come to the Nairne Carols By the Lake event at Byethorne Park at Nairne on 8th December. The Red Cross ladies will be there from 5:30 serving strawberries and cream and selling raffle tickets to our Christmas Hampers. Please come and support us and have a great evening welcoming the festive season.

Finally we would like to wish you all a Very Merry Christmas and A Happy New Year. Thankyou for your support this year and remember you are welcome to join us at our next meeting on 6th February at the Nairne Uniting Church Hall from 1:30pm.
