

# BUS SERVICE PROPOSAL

At the January meeting of the NDRA a proposed timetable and revised route structure was presented by myself for members to peruse at their leisure.

The proposal has been forwarded officially to Mr Dan Cregan MP & Mr Adrian Pederick MP for Hammond. Mr Pederick has presented the proposal to the Transport Minister Mr Stephan Knoll for his consideration.

It is hoped that some of the monies recently saved by the transport department can be utilised to provide a much needed improvement to bus services east of Mount Barker through Nairne, Kanmantoo & Callington then onto Murray Bridge.

The proposal effectively amalgamates the current AdelaideMetro services (Routes 836, 837, 841F, 842X & T842) with LinkSA services (Routes 805, 806, 807 & 808)

The City based services would remain unchanged but with some slight timing adjustments. The big change is the elimination of Routes 806 & 808 as they will become Route 807 trips.

All trips to and from Murray Bridge, with the exception of Route 805, will operate via Littlehampton, Nairne, Dawesley, Kanmantoo, Callington & Monarto. Structuring the routes this way provides a two hourly frequency between Mount Barker & Murray Bridge, as well as an improved frequency to Nairne.

In the proposal, the Friday only service from Callington (Route 836) would be altered to operate from Harrogate to Mount Barker via Brukunga and will run one round trip Monday to Friday.

It is hoped that the AdelaideMetro boundary will be extended further east from Nairne, but in any case the service will operate part metro and part country. Route 852 to Strathalbyn currently operates like this. We are eagerly awaiting the Minister's response to this important issue.

### ***'I see a great future in tourism for the town and district.'***



# Nairne Museum

The Nairne Museum has been open now for nearly four years. In that time we have expanded the collection considerably, developed new displays and added the shed area as a display of agricultural and oversize items.

We have been helped by community members who have brought into us items and information. One large contribution was from a resident who was planning to sell his house and needed to dispose of accumulated items including a lot from his father. Some fairly rare items were a set of pictorial atlases published in 1887 plus a 1927 South Australian directory which list every business and resident in the state as of that year including their occupation. So this has been invaluable for people who were researching their families. If they lived in South Australia in 1927 they would be listed. People who have come in expecting to find maybe a couple of ancestors have found up to 2 full pages.

The museum is focussed largely on Nairne history but also has some items of general interest e.g. some 1930s box cameras and a working 1930s record player. Comparing this with an IPOD shows just how far technology has come since then, both in terms of quality of reproduction and the size of the unit.

We have a wide range of photos including one from 1996 showing Nairne after a fall of snow! A bit hard to imagine during the current hot weather.

We have more material than we are able to display so we will be cycling some displays over the coming months to ensure they are available at some stage during the year.

We have just completed a review of signage to make the museum more visible to passers by.

We expect to be involved with Council in the clearing of the heritage Dawes Bridge sometime in the near future. This bridge was part of the main road to the east in the late 19th century and has partially collapsed.

We can arrange for groups to visit at suitable times and have had several do so over the last year or so. For one bus company we opened the museum every weekday for a month for a range of groups.



Please try to find time on a Sunday afternoon (2 to 4) to visit us and, if you have any interesting items that you might consider donating, feel free to bring them to show us.

# Byethorne Park Redevelopment

In August 2017 the State Government announced \$40m for a Fund My Neighbourhood program, giving South Australians the ability to nominate and vote for projects to improve their streets, suburbs and towns.

Nairne locals, Katrina Windebank and Lynette Sharp, identified two eligible projects for the Fund My Neighbourhood program and Council agreed to sponsor and deliver the projects if successful.

Through the online community voting system, Byethorne Park at Nairne was awarded two grants in November 2017 to design and deliver a Nature Play area to the value of \$100,000 and a kick around area to the value of \$150,000.

To ensure the project meets the needs of the Nairne community, a Fund My Neighbourhood - Byethorne Park Working Group was established as the key mechanism for communication and consultation between Council and Nairne's community representatives.

The working group undertook a process of sharing ideas for the site and sought input from the broader community through door-knocking local residents and talking to local primary school students.

Through the consultation sessions, key priorities were established, including the addition of Block 20 and the unmade road, Packard Street East into the Byethorne Park footprint, which enabled the development of draft concept plans.

At the final community consultation day on 11 October 2018, feedback was finalised and

Tuesday March 5th is Shrove Tuesday often known as Pancake Day.

In this issue I would like to talk to you again about Vehicle Security and scams which unfortunately still continues to be a problem in the Hills Fleurieu Local Service Area.

We are still getting a large number of reported thefts of valuable items from unlocked motor vehicles in the Hills Fleurieu Local Service Area. Officer in Charge of the Hills-Fleurieu Local Service Area, Superintendent Mark Fairney, would like to remind people of the following advice to avoid becoming a victim of this type of crime. "If you don't lock it you are going to lose it, don't leave your vehicle unlocked in the hope that a thief will not damage the car to get in. Removing or hiding valuables makes your car much less of a target, the two seconds of effort required to lock your car or remove valuable items is nothing compared to the time taken in replacing property, reporting the theft to the Police and dealing with your insurance company."

**By following these simple security tips you can minimise theft from your vehicle:-**

- Ensure all valuables are removed from your vehicle or conceal them in the boot of the vehicle before arriving at your destination.
- Lock your vehicle doors and close windows.
- Install an audible alarm.
- At night park your vehicle in a well-lit area.
- Engrave your valuables with your driver's licence number prefixed with an "S" for South Australia.
- Park your vehicle in a garage at night where possible.
- Avoid hiding a second set of keys in the vehicle – if the vehicle is broken into they may find the keys and take the car as well as your valuables.
- Avoid placing bags and wallets on the passenger seat where they could be easily stolen.

Scams continue to be a problem, like the scam where victims are contacted by persons reporting to be from the Australian Tax Office and being threatened with arrest and legal action in relation to a tax debt. These persons sound very convincing, are aggressive and intimidating.

**There has been a recent incident similar to this in which a would-be scammer claimed to work for the SA Police.**

The caller claimed to be a police officer and told their intended victim that there was an outstanding warrant in their name in relation to a tax debt. The victim was asked to pay their tax bill using gift cards. A shop assistant raised the possibility that the caller was a fraudster, prompting the victim to visit a police station. Of concern was the fact the telephone number displayed was that of a South Australian police station; however the call was not being made from that location.

Unfortunately modifying the caller ID is a simple technique which can be used by scammers as a way to build credibility by making a call or SMS appear to come from a reputable agency. In the recent case, the intended victim visited the police station only to discover there was no officer of the name they were given working there.

**Nor do SA Police make calls on behalf of the tax department, or ask for payments in gift cards.**

While there has only been the one report received in relation to the exploitation of this particular phone number, police are aware this type of practice is used by many would-be scammers to create a false impression about where a call is being made from.

Irrespective of the phone number displayed, or who an unsolicited caller claims to work for, it is important to take independent steps to verify a caller's identity before providing any personal information or making payments of any sort.

**Please remember these tips to protect yourself:-**

- Hang up when someone you don't know calls
- Immediately delete emails from people you don't know, and from agencies or businesses that you didn't agree to receive emails from – do not click on links in those emails
- Never send money online to someone you haven't met in person
- If in doubt contact the government agency from a phone number or website that you have located and were not directed to
- Remember the ATO will not request payment of a debt via iTunes, Google Play cards or Bitcoins

- Never give your personal, credit card or online account details over the phone unless you made the call and the phone number came from a trusted source
- If you think you have provided your bank account details to a scammer, contact your bank or financial institution immediately
- Never give an unsolicited person remote access to your computer. You may compromise the security of your device and your personal information
- Ensure your computer is protected with regularly updated anti-virus and anti-spyware software

**Please share this information - and discuss the prevalence of these types of scams with people in your circle who may be less savvy about this type of technology or scam activity.**

## MOSAICS IN NAIRNE MAIN STREET TRANSFORMED HISTORY!

Recently eight of the twelve mosaics which are in the Nairne Main Street have been transformed into planters. There have been overwhelming positive comments regarding these mosaics being given a "new lease of life" and a number of local employees and residents have offered to help to maintain the plants in these mosaic planters which is fantastic.

The transforming of the mosaics to planters was made possible by a Main Street Activation Grant from the Mt Barker District Council which was made available to the Nairne and District Residents' Association a while ago. Through devoted work by a number of members of NDRA and Kelly Pearce of Fleur de Lis Gardens the eight mosaics transforming to planters, in the Nairne Main Street, became reality early in January 2019 just in time for them to be admired by visitors and locals at the time of the Stage 3 Women's Tour Down Under Race which commenced in Nairne on 12th January 2019. With further consultation with Mt Barker District Council we hope to see the other four mosaics, which were removed by council at the time of the re-development of the northern side of the Nairne Main Street, re-located and made into planters along the Nairne Main Street.

### DO YOU KNOW THE HISTORY OF THESE MOSAICS?

Following some research on the mosaics we have discovered some of the history around these beautiful works of art which we would like to share with you. We quote from an article which appeared in the "Nairne Towards 2000 Main Street Program" Issue No 5 October 1996:-

### "CRACKLING"

Crackling, Nairne's current Community Arts Project is well underway. A mosaic tile technique is being used to create unique works of art for the Main Street. Local artist, Hellen Mackay, has been employed to work with the Year 6 & 7 students to design and manufacture twelve rubbish bins for the Main Road. The bins will be launched as an adjunct to the "Pigs Might Fly Festival" in April 1997. They will become a focus for the Youth Arts component of the festival. Each bin has been individually designed by the students, with support from Hellen. Whimsical themes of life in Nairne have been the focus. Everything from the creek environment, to life on the farm, has been captured in a colourful display and unique interpretation.

Once the designs were completed and drawn to actual size, came the onerous task of breaking or crackling the tiles. This task has been tackled with enthusiasm, and I must say, in some cases restraint was enforced.

Tiles are now being laid out on the designs, ready to be transferred and adhered to the bins.

Once completed and installed the bins will be an everlasting expression of life in Nairne. Objects with both practical and artistic value. Works of Art unique to Nairne and created by our own community.

This project would not have been possible without the funding from and the support of the District Council of Mt Barker, the South Australian Country Arts Trust, Nairne Primary School and Beaumont Tiles.

Further articles which appeared in The Courier in October 1996 and March 1997 state that Cathy Radford (who is still a resident of Nairne) was the co-ordinator of the Nairne Toward 2000 Project and that the "Pigs Might Fly" will be held in the Main Street of Nairne on Saturday and Sunday April 19th and 20th 1997. It will feature a range of cultural events including visual arts exhibitions, music and drama.

For your information the names of the mosaics are "Pig Patrol", "Frootopia", "One Step Further", "Stuck in the Mud", "New Chickens on the Block", "Flower Power", "Birdwatch", "The Moo Moo Cows", "Spirits of the Bins", "Hole in One", "Funky Legs" and "Farmer's Paradise".

It would appear that Nairne was an amazing little town in those days and locals made things happen. Let's continue to work together in this community to make this town a very special place to be a part of.

We will research further and hopefully have more interesting historic information to pass on to you next issue.

As a friendly reminder it's illegal to park over a driveway entrance, block a footpath or park on a yellow line.

Council staff will be monitoring the area over the coming weeks as an education exercise and fines may be issued to drivers insisting on breaking the rules.






