I know personally a number of people who lost everything and others who had managed to save their homes but lost sheds, vehicles and livestock. The amazing work of all the CFS personnel cannot be underestimated. These men and women are the salt of the earth and on behalf of our community I thank each and every one of them for their tireless efforts over the festive period to protect lives and homes whilst being away from their own families.

In the immediate aftermath of this horrific event I was heartened to see and hear of numerous acts of compassion from within our community and from beyond with overwhelming support with goods, food and assistance.

I saw first hand the anguish and sheer bewilderment on people's faces as they were struggling to work out what had happened to them. All of us must ensure that we keep in touch with those who suffered loss or were affected in anyway by these fires as they can over the coming weeks and months suffer from a range of mental health issues.

The fire grounds are slowly regenerating themselves and this is a marvellous thing that nature does so very well, unfortunately, the mental wellbeing of humans can sometimes not be easy to fix.

Cudlee Creek bushfire

2019 was the hottest and driest year in living memory. This was part of the reason for the intensity of the Cudlee Creek fire.

The fire that threatened all our homes was devastating to those caught in its path. Bushfire victims experience a traumatic episode that stays with them for life, if you or someone you know needs professional help please contact a trusted health professional immediately.

The members of the Country Fire Service, Metropolitan Fire Service, Department for Environment & Water fire crews and landholders in their smaller mobile fire fighting units will always be remembered for saving most of the district. Keeping that fire to the outskirts of the larger towns was an outstanding effort.

There will be a time for an investigation and follow up action. Every person will have an opportunity to have their opinions heard.

Road repairs and fire water tank storage needs are high on the agenda of Council.

Since the fire was controlled last month many agencies, businesses and individuals have shown compassion and sensitivity towards assisting those who were impacted, community spirit at its best.

Please look out for your neighbour, if you have a concern please contact Council, 8391 7200 and they will direct you to the most appropriate service.

Council is considering rate relief for those people in the fire zone, we are all very keen to hear from people what their views are in this matter.

It is a balancing act that takes much of your elected members and Council staff time to get right. We do need to take advantage of large state and federal government grants for major sporting hubs/town centres but we also need to ensure people can safely walk and cycle around the older towns, like Nairne.

My fellow North Ward Councillors, Narelle Hardingham, Simon Westwood and Harry Seager acknowledge the area north of Nairne has done it extra tough because of the Cudlee Creek fire, we are all keen to engage with you, we do care and wish you all the best as you move through your recovery.

Hazards around the footpaths for walkers

We have many walkers in Nairne who regularly walk around the town on the Main Rd and other streets.

One thing which they encounter is overhanging vegetation onto the footpaths. Mostly it only causes some inconvenience but sometimes it is quite dangerous. For example rose branches over the footpath, at eye level in particular, can do serious, even permanent, damage to eyes.

Similarly flowering shrubs e.g. wisteria with flowers can harbor bees which, if disturbed could be very nasty.

I am not sure who would be responsible if someone was hurt by any of these but it would take minimal effort to correct the situation and make it safe.

One of the activities we encourage to visitors to undertake is the self-guided Mural and History walk and, apart from the possible harm caused, it would be bad publicity if a visitor was hurt doing it.

So please check your boundary hedge/growth and get the secateurs out if appropriate.

Christmas has come and gone and with the warm weather some of us may want to get out on our bicycles and go for a ride. Here are some tips about how you can keep your bicycle safe. I have also included some safety tips for young people for when they are out and about or on their way to school.

Bicycle Security

Bikes are a popular mode of transport and owners should consider ways to secure their bike when it is not in use.

To reduce your chances of becoming a victim of bike theft, please consider the following crime prevention security tips:

- Engrave or mark your bike frame (near the serial number) with an ultraviolet (UV) pen, microdot or by other permanent means with your driver's licence number prefixed by the letter 'S' for South Australia, e.g. S123456.
- Mark all your accessories, including helmet, lights, pump, saddle, etc.
- Take a photograph of your bike.
- Complete the Bike Passport and keep it in a safe place.
- Purchase and fit a good quality bike lock. Your bike dealer may be able to assist you in choosing a lock.
- Always park and secure your bike in well-lit and populated areas.
- Always lock the bike frame and both wheels to a secure object.
- When securing your bike, remove equipment including helmet, lights, pump, etc.
- Never leave your bike unattended and unlocked, even for a short period of time.
- When at home, secure your bike in a locked shed or inside your house.

Safety for Young People

All young people have the right to be and feel safe and it is important, no matter what your age or circumstances, that you discuss with your parents strategies on staying safe.

Consider these safety tips when you are out and about:

- Check timetables of transport so you can limit waiting times at stops.
- If possible meet up with a friend or other students either at your stop or while travelling.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Where possible, sit close to the driver. Select to sit with another passenger as opposed to having someone choosing to sit next to you.
- If the behaviour of someone is offensive or illegal, move away and tell the driver immediately and contact police.
- When out walking always be alert, walk with confidence and stay in populated areas.
- Walk against the flow of traffic if possible and walk with a friend or other students.
- Don't take short cuts through dark streets or isolated parks.
- If someone in a car stops and asks for directions, do not stop and continue walking.
- Never get into a vehicle with someone you don't know or don't feel comfortable with.
- When using headphones, only have one earpiece in so you can still hear everything around you.
- If you take a regular route to school, identify safe locations. This may be a friend's house, local shop, or hospital.
- If you are going somewhere before or after school, tell an adult.

If you find yourself in a dangerous situation:

- Trust your instincts and leave the area immediately.
- Yell for help and make a lot of noise to draw attention to you.
- Make a note of the person or vehicle registration number.
- Seek refuge somewhere safe and immediately call police

The Nairne and District Residents' Association (NDRA) is a group of volunteer people interested in the social, cultural and economic development of Nairne.

We work with the Mount Barker District Council, the Government, our elected representatives and other stakeholders to represent and advocate the views of the community on matters that affect our prosperity and lifestyle. We believe that collaboration and advocacy are the keys to good outcomes for all parties. We exist to hold Council, Government and other stakeholders to account on their commitment to Nairne, but we aim to do this in a culture of respect, rather than one that is adversarial and confrontational.

Our recent work saw the successful passage of the Nairne & Environs Development Plan Amendment (DPA), which defines the key blueprint for the future of the area and the Main Street redevelopment, which when complete at the end of 2021 will completely transform our town centre.

Four times a year, at the start of each season, we publish Nairne & District News, which is a significant community newsletter that includes reports, news and advertising relevant to the local community. Nairne & District News is compiled by volunteers and funded by advertising and a small cover charge. Copies are available from most Main Street businesses, selected locations in the district and by email.

We also run events such as a Family Film Night, Nairne Community Carols and Nairne History Festival. We promote heritage and culture by supporting the Nairne heritage trail, the interpretive plaques and the Nairne Museum. Our website nairne.org.au has comprehensive information about our history and access to various resources and contacts to assist and support the community.



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Byethorne Park Development

Back in July 2017, I didn't think we would come this far with an unmade road and a barren block.

My first goal was to ensure that unmade road Packard Street East would be closed and retained as community land. The Nairne and Districts Residents Association (NDRA) and residents supported the closure and retain option, which saw Packard Street East (which adjoined block 20 of Byethorne Park) closed and retained as community land.

I will be forever grateful to Brett Gabel for bringing the issue of Packard Street East to my attention in the first place, as it originally raised as land that could possibly be sold to fund future park development.

From there it was just sheer luck that the *Fund My Neighbourhood* campaign was launched. It was perfect timing, and this was just what we needed to turn this unmade road and barren weedy block into an inviting community space, for all to enjoy.

Once again, the local community was there to support my and Lynette Sharp's idea for a nature playground. Nairne was lucky to achieve three funding projects, of which two were at Byethorne Park (\$150,000 for the kicking field and \$100,000 for the playground).

After all the meetings, door knocking and handing out flyers, we now had more work to do.

The Mount Barker Council had sponsored both the kicking field idea and the nature playground, but the funds were tight. We then had to consult with the local community as to what they would like to see in this community space, in keeping with the original ideas that got voted on.

After many more meetings, door knocking, reviewing beautiful thoughtful correspondence from the kids at Nairne Primary school, hours of social media interactions and hundreds of emails, a plan was formed, and the council went to work on designing, costing and delivering the project.

We fast realised that our big ideas had to be scaled back, as we came to understand the cost behind it all. It was hard to cull ideas and make compromises on the outcome we had hoped for, but at the end of the day we are extremely happy with the result and it will forever be an improvement on the unmade road and barren block with weeds and cars for sale.

We all now have a beautiful irrigated kicking field, with a substantial path, fencing, stormwater controls, landscaping, seating, disk swing, balancing & stepping logs and amazing nature inspired play equipment.

On the 11th of January 2020 we had the official opening hosted by the NDRA, with Dan Cregan MP and Mayor Anne Ferguson cutting the ribbon and officially declaring the redevelopment open.

Both Lynette Sharp and I hope that this will become a jewel in Nairne's crown, for all to come and enjoy this open community space. We hope it inspires other to seek out opportunities to improve other community lands in Nairne.

I would just like to end with exciting news that Nairne Landcare Group have been successful in achieving an additional grant of \$10,000, from Federal Government's Communities Environment Program, to do further work at the northern end of Byethorne park.

They plan to develop a butterfly garden with a bug hotel.

This will be a project that the community can get involved with.

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

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
