## Nairne students in WWI

The students of Helen Arbury-Smith's class at Nairne Primary School, with help from RSL vice-president Alan Morley and interested parent, Debbie McKay, have been researching past members of Nairne School who went to World War I.

So far, 33 former students have been identified:

Albert James Buxton and his brother John William; Percy Thomas Davis; Bertram Ryland Pearce Downing; Howard William Lewis Downing; Edwin Folley, killed in France August 1918; Frank Roy Gilbert; Percy Griffin; John Joseph Heffernan, who was awarded the Military Medal for action on the Western Front; Donald Gordon Hepworth; Frederick William Heyer and his brother, William Gottlieb; Albert Victor Lever; Sydney Earl Love, killed in action in France; Dennis Lugg, who became a prisoner of war in Germany, and his brother William Lugg; Charles Mahoney; James Gordon May and his brother Thomas William May;

## Trees For Towns: an opportunity to revitalise Nairne

You may have seen posters or flyers in and around Nairne inviting you to join a community project called Trees For Towns, being run by Trees For Life as part of their 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations.

Communities from every part of South Australia are invited to register their interest in Trees For Towns, with the 30 best coordinated and most committed chosen to take part and grow 1,000 seedlings indigenous to their local areas. Seedlings will be grown over Summer, and the planting events and celebrations will take place in Winter 2012.

### Would you like to see Trees For Towns come to Nairne? Please join us!

*“We are looking for communities that want to learn more about the value of revegetation and biodiversity, who want to use this opportunity as a way to enhance the spirit of community in their town and who want to share the experience and celebrate their success with all the locals,” Trees For Life’s Chief Executive Officer Carmel Dundon said.*

*“To ensure the long term success of the project - with every single local provenance seed being assured the best chance of developing into a mature drought resistant native plant - we will provide training and support to guarantee success in each town.” Trees For Life*

A number of residents have already expressed interest in taking part in growing the seedlings or planting local species on their land. We are seeking volunteers to help propagate, grow, plant or care for these seedlings. A planting plan for 2012 will also be developed so if you are too busy to grow the seedlings you can still take part on Planting Day.

By taking part in Trees For Towns you will have the chance to revitalise Nairne’s appearance, learn about the importance of biodiversity, reintroduce native plants to cleared areas, provide habitat for birds such as the threatened Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoo, and get together with friends in your community.

If you would like any planting to be done on your land, we need a letter of permission and support to include in our registration. We are currently applying to Mt Barker Council for permission to plant on Council land.

**Did you know?** *“In SA alone some 26 plant, 23 mammal and 2 bird species are extinct, with 50% of native birds in the Mt Lofty Ranges alone either threatened or declining.” -Trees For Life*

Our application must be submitted by **6 May 2011** and we will find out in June if we have been successful. We welcome your suggestions, questions and participation! ## Councillor's commentary....

Hello again. Since my report to you in the previous *Nairne News*, a number of things have been happening.


**Council 2011-12 Budget:** councillors and staff have been working on the draft 2011-12 Annual Business Plan (ABP) and Budget. While, at this stage, details of the ABP and budget are yet to be settled, I can tell you that, among other things, I have promoted the following items for approval by Council:

- ◆ commissioning of permanent flood mitigation measures to alleviate problems experienced by North Railway Tce residents
- ◆ interim measures to provide some easing of parking problems experienced by parents dropping off and picking up Nairne Primary School students on Saleyard Rd
- ◆ financial assistance to the Nairne Oval Committee to commission a consultant to develop the Committee's 3-year plan for a major upgrade of the Nairne Oval complex
- ◆ renewal of the BMX track facility on Matthew Rd; and
- ◆ construction of a number of new footpaths in various parts of Nairne.

At this time, the draft 2011-12 ABP and Budget is expected to be tabled at a normal Council meeting on Monday 16 May. A public meeting on the budget will then follow on a date to be settled, before Council meets again on 20 June to approve the ABP and Budget. All meetings start at 7:00 pm.

**Ministerial DPA and Council's Strategic Plan:** since the State Planning Minister's decision earlier this year that the DPA for Mt Barker, Littlehampton and Nairne proceed, Council, through its Strategic Planning & Development Policy Committee (SPDPC), has been engaged in pursuing all the things that need to be done to ensure that new residential developments and attendant infrastructure requirements are considered and implemented in an orderly and timely manner. To date, most focus has been on a proposed new connector road to meet the needs of new residential and light industrial development to the south of Mt Barker, as well as water and sewerage services.

For the first time, and at Council's instigation, on 12 April a number of developers, affected land-owners, State Government officials, Council elected members and staff

met to discuss future implementation of the DPA and its effects on the wider fabric of the District. The forum demonstrated that all parties were willing to proceed in good faith and with the best possible outcomes for all in mind.

Two public meetings will be held to give the wider community an opportunity to hear first-hand details of the strategies considered necessary to proceed - the first at the Wallis Theatre complex on Wednesday **4 May**, the second in the **Nairne Soldiers' Memorial Hall on Thursday 5 May**. Both meetings start at **7:00 pm**.

**Other items of interest:** the State transport department (DTEI) has been undertaking an upgrade of the **Nairne-Woodside Road** between the railway crossing and Pulleine/North Roads. The current work is due to be completed in the current financial year, with more to be done in 2011-12. I have asked that, once this work has been completed by DTEI, Council program the construction of a footpath on the western side of Nairne Rd between Stirling and Pulleine Roads.

The '**Chapman's Plaza feature**' adjacent to the Nairne Institute has been renovated. Unfortunately, as a result of vandalism, the water fountain was found to be unrepairable. Consequently, the feature has now been filled with soil and plantings of native grass put in place. This work was completed by Council's field staff in readiness for the Anzac Day dawn service and 'gunfire breakfast' organised by the Nairne RSL and Nairne & District Lions Club.



## More housing and a shopping complex proposed for Nairne

The large block of land to the north of Princes Highway at the entrance to Nairne is again the subject of a development proposal presented to a meeting of the Mt Barker Strategic Planning Development Policy Committee in March (<http://www.dcmtbarker.sa.gov.au/site/page.cfm?u=535> Agenda March 28 2011 Part 1). Some years ago, a proposal for an industrial estate on the land was quashed when Nairne residents mounted strong resistance to the proposal. This time, the proposal outlines a plan for a housing estate and retail shopping centre, including a petrol station (see plan below).



The housing would be in addition to the housing estate recently approved as part of the State Government's 30-year plan for Greater Adelaide and Ministerial Development Plan Amendment (MDPA). It would involve the rezoning of more rural land for residential purposes, providing for an additional 158 houses outside the current town boundary. Currently the land is used mainly for cattle grazing, but much of it has been classified Class 1 agricultural land (high quality) by Primary Industries and Resources South Australia, according to the 30-year plan. The developers claim that "the viability of no existing or future retail precinct or centre would be threatened from the development....", however some of the shops along the Main Street of Nairne believe their businesses would become unviable should the development go ahead.

Representatives from the District Council of Mt Barker will be presenting information on issues relevant to Nairne as part of the development of a Structure Plan. Two forums are to be held in early May (see next page), and at each forum, approximately half of the time will be allocated to the presentation of information by council representatives, with the remaining time for questions.



# Rezoned Land in Nairne and Mount Barker **What is happening now?**

The State Government approved the rezoning of land in Mount Barker and Nairne in December 2010. Whilst this was not the outcome Council was hoping for, Council is now working hard to address the issues identified during the rezoning process to attempt to get the best outcome possible for the community.

This includes working on a detailed structure plan for Nairne, Littlehampton and Mount Barker which outlines where key infrastructure will go such as recreation, roads etc as well as guiding the staging of the development.

## The Arts

John Lewis McKenney, killed in France April 1917; George Hood Millar, killed in France July 1916; Robert William Morley; John Leo Noye; Cyril Frederick Packard; Alfred Clarence Richardson; Cecil William Robinson, died while a prisoner of war in Germany; Frank Scott; John Henry Sharp, who became a prisoner of war in Germany in 1917; William Charles Leslie Strange; John Francis Thomas; Percy Overton Thomas; James Hubert Warland, who became a prisoner of war in Germany; and Frank Perry Watts. One of a former headmaster's sons also served, and research will continue when a complete list of former students is obtained.

Debbie McKay observes "The students have been really enthusiastic about learning about these past students. It has also sparked an interest in some of them finding out about their own families war histories."



## History Month


South Australia will be celebrating 175 years of European settlement in May, and there are two events planned for Mt Barker.

# The Passionate Spirit

Behind the fun at the Pub Spirit meeting at the Hahndorf Old Mill in April were serious messages delivered by the two speakers, Raphaela Mazzone and Tony Hill. Without any question they were spiritual people intent on making a difference in their world.

Raphaela is the daughter of Alduino Mazzone and Susan Liean, authors of the recent book "A Passionate Schooling: key ideas behind Steiner Waldorf Education". Alduino is accredited with the establishment of the Waldorf Steiner School at Mt. Barker. Raphaela has been profoundly influenced by her home background and schooling. She is an artist and musician, able to encourage all present at the meeting to match their choral singing with physical action. Above the makeshift choir-in-action soared her melodious, rich soprano voice. Laughter was the unprogrammed sound effect. Raphaela will leave the Waldorf Steiner School next year to join an Australian choir on international tour. She will search for ways to use her talents to make a difference in the world.

Tony Hill, on the other hand, was a big, bearded biker, exactly as he presented in the SA film "The Marriage of Figaro". The program aims to protect children and families, at their own request, against the threat of child abusers, simply by being present outside the home or taking them on outings.

Imagine any abuser entering a home with more than 20 leathered bikers on huge machines outside! Police checks on their members are essential. Bikers, always in numbers, are instructed not to enter the home on any provocation. But Tony's joy in life has a spiritual quality, with no doubt in his mind that the spirit of Jesus is around him, leading him towards justice and peace.

The next Pub Spirit evening is on Tuesday May 3 at the Hahndorf Old Mill. A buffet dinner is available from 6 pm to 7.20 pm (bookings 8388 7888), with presentations from 7.20 pm to 9 pm. The theme this time is "Spirit in a War Zone" with Norbert Sobotta telling of his experiences as a child born in Germany towards the end of World War II, and the influence his experiences have on his life now. With him is Petra Ball, whose studies in International Law and Relations lead to her involvement with international humanitarian organisations in countries overseas that are under extreme stress.
