Yours truly won 2nd prize in the 'Ugliest Man' competition which was a re-enactment of an actual fundraising event held in the early days of Nairne to raise funds for various projects around the town. Apparently, the event once raised £1700 back in the day.

District Development

There has been much development and planning of developments within the district over the past 12 months. It is exciting to see the re-development of Byethorne Park which is slowly taking shape.

The Woodside Road intersection is about to enter the design phase and whilst this has been a long time coming it is something that will greatly improve traffic flow in the area once it is completed. A little bit more pain for some long term gain.

Towards the end of this year work will commence on the new clubrooms / function centre at the Callington Oval.

Work on the old Chapman's site is progressing steadily after a hiccup due to unforeseen issues on the site that are being rectified.

Public Transport

There are a number of public transport issues bubbling away under the surface and the future of bus services in Nairne and beyond could be quite exciting. Currently, the Government has called for tenders to operate AdelaideMetro services which includes those operating in the hills. Pressure has been mounting on the Government from a number of circles to improve bus services within our district.

Nairne Museum

NAIRNE MUSEUM PROGRESS

The Museum is continuing to progress in collecting and displaying Nairne's history

The NAMES database is now set up and we are aiming to get all the names we have into this so that visitors can look up their family and any other connections.

If you have information on any past Nairne residents please call in and leave it with the supervisor of the day (Sundays 2 to 4 pm). This is a big and ongoing task but will be very useful as a resource.

We have added back panels to some of the display cabinets to provide extra information in written format to allow more artefacts to be displayed in the cabinets.

We continue to receive excellent material from residents going back to the mid 1800s which enables us to develop timelines. We recently received a big pack of old documents including Certificates of Title and similar which will help us connect some of the old families of the town.

The Museum committee is considering writing a definitive History of Nairne as there is not a comprehensive history of the town since the School's 'Over the Hills to Nairne'. It will be proposed to be based on the buildings and the people/activities involved with them. Of course this will also provide a timeline for the development of the town.

We now have a video of Keith Conlon's Postcards section on Nairne which gives a 5 minute historical overview. We also have a video of the Nairne 150th anniversary celebrations with a parade along the Main St and activities at the Oval. Anyone who lived in the town in 1989 should have a look to see if they can see themselves 30 years younger! It is very interesting in that it shows the ethos of the town at that time.

We look forward to the development of the Nairne Village Green. Hopefully this will bring more people into the town centre and thus the Museum.

This will be a major project which will provide much enhanced facilities in that area and to which the Museum will need to adapt.

Adelaide Hills Farmers Market

This year marks a decade since local farmers came together to establish a market where they could sell their produce direct to the community.

Nairne residents Rob Rees and Anama Morris are two of those people. Their business, Bald Hills Olive Grove, is now a stalwart of the Adelaide Hills Farmers Market held every Saturday morning in Mount Barker.

The market is an important part of their business, Anama says, because it upholds their environmental and social values. "Apart from the market at the Adelaide Showgrounds and a couple of wholesale customers we don't sell outside the Adelaide Hills," Anama explains.

"Being at the market allows us to build community connections and I feel like we are doing our small bit to provide good, healthy food for our neighbours. "It is also important to maintain the skills to produce fundamental foods."

The first stage of the 30-acre olive grove at 103 Bald Hills Road in Nairne was planted by Rob and Anama in 1998. The couple had just travelled through Italy and Spain and fell in love with the landscape and its romantic associations. Previously they had grown hay but they wanted something that was less physically demanding and would embrace the emerging healthy food industry of that time.

"I got involved with the Australian Olives Association (formerly Olive South Australia) to learn how to grow them," Anama says. "Then I got on the Council and later the Board. "We joined up with other Hills growers so we had a critical mass to sell our products and share knowledge."

Those partners have since moved out of the olive industry but Rob and Anama proudly continue on.

There is a lot of hard work involved with tending 700 olive trees, Anama says. There are also plenty of challenges and rewards. Weather is a constant challenge and makes the Nairne harvest much later than in other regions.

In winter the frost freezes the olives and there are times like last autumn when there was a distinct lack of rain. Government bureaucracy is another ongoing challenge. "Many people don't appreciate the amount of work that goes into just producing the product," Anama says. "And then there are all the tiddly poms – like labels and packaging.

"These all add costs in terms of time and money." But the challenges fade each time she speaks with a customer at the market, Anama says. "The reward is the pleasure market customers get from the healthy taste of our olives, oil, and related condiments."

Bald Hills Olive Grove products have also won bronze medals in years when the weather was more suited to growing olives.

Anama and Rob are keen environmentalists and where possible apply reduce, reuse and recycle to their business. Empty olive oil flagons can be returned to the market so they can be washed, sterilised and refilled.

Their unseen environmental action is the Red Gum Revegetation Project.

"We have an area at the back of our property much of which was boggy with nasty spiky weeds including blackberries," Anama says.

"Together with Wayne Brown of Environments by Design we are restoring the kangaroo grasses, planting red gum seedlings and indigenous understory.

"It should attract and protect vulnerable birds and provide habitat for our little family of kangaroos."

The project also offsets the damage done when 32 mature trees were removed for the Bald Hills Interchange.

The desire to produce healthy, local and sustainable food has carried on to the next generation, Anama says. Their son Brendan farms red lentils, faba beans, wheat, barley, and sheep on Kangaroo Island.

Rob is a member of the Department of Agriculture and passionate about the introduction of pulses into crop rotation. Together with son Brendan he is trialling the farming of chick peas on Kangaroo Island.

Anama and Rob love Nairne for its close community, deep history, great stone houses and its very talented artists.

Celebrate Nairne's Birthday

The township of NAIRNE S.A.
Founded by Matthew Smillie 1839

On January the 24th 1839 Matthew, Elizabeth & William Smillie arrived in Adelaide on the INDUS out of Dundee, Scotland (South Australian Passenger List, 1839).

Soon after, Matthew purchased 4000 acres of land where he established one of the first sheep farms in the Adelaide Hills. Here he built his home, The Valleys (in 1844) and the first survey peg was planted for the new township of Nairne (1839). Nairne was named after Matthew's wife Elizabeth Corse Nairne.

This year we are celebrating the 180th birthday of the establishment of Nairne with a Big Birthday Afternoon Tea Party and everyone is invited.

To be held on Sunday the 20th of October at 2pm at the Nairne Soldiers Memorial Hall, we would love for past residents as well as current to come and celebrate Nairne's founding.

Come and enjoy some of the history of Nairne while chatting with residents and participating in recording some of Nairne's history.

An advertisement appearing in the South Australian Register on 23 November 1839, described the projected town:

Proposed Township is situated in a beautiful valley, well-sheltered from the prevailing winds, including both sides of a creek, in which there is at all seasons abundance of fine water.

The adjoining hills afford extensive views of Mount Barker and the country around. As the climate is salubrious, and the elevation from the plains considerable, it is a most desirable spot for summer residences, particularly for persons requiring change of air.

The soil is a deep black loam, thickly covered with a rich sward of grass and the neighbourhood abounds with good building freestone and limestone.

ST. JAMES BLAKISTON NEWSLETTER

July 25th is St. James day. St. James (the Greater) is our patron saint and so on July 25th we had a service of Evensong followed by a meal at the Great Eastern Hotel, both were well attended.

St. James is one of Jesus' disciples and often known as one of the sons of Thunder. One can only wonder, was it his booming voice, or did he have a thunderous temper. Whatever he was truly a faithful servant and became a martyr in AD44.

St. James as a prominent apostle among the twelve and left his life as a fisherman to follow Jesus.

He made a trip to Spain to spread the Word. He later returned to Judea where he was beheaded by King Herod Agrippa. His remains or relics are said to be buried in Santiago de Compostela in Spain which explains why he is the patron Saint of Spain.

In Spain there is a walk which thousands of pilgrims from around the world tread each year. It is called El Camino De Santiago – the Way of St. James. Legend holds that St. James remains were carried by boat from Jerusalem to north-west Spain the region known as Galacia. There are several routes but they all lead Santiago de Compostela. It was highly travelled until the 16th century when the Black Death, Protestant Reformation and political unrest in Europe led to its decline but in this current age people take this way as a challenge or something to take from the bucket list.

Our St. James church at Blakiston has a beautiful stained glass window above the altar with St. James represented as a pilgrim with his staff, gourd and scallop shell. The shell is the recognized symbol of all pilgrims because of its abundance on the shores of Palestine.

We too, have a scallop shell which hangs near the altar and was brought back by a parishioner who walked the Camino as a pilgrimage.

Sometimes it is good to consider the faith of St. James because even his trip to Spain was quite an undertaking in Jesus time leave alone to spread the gospel. He WAS a pilgrim and it is good to consider our own lives today as we live in relative comfort surrounded by present-day amenities.

We have regular communion services at St. James on the second and fourth Sundays of each month and our fellowship group meets on the first Thursday of each month where we share outings and other things to enable us to support outreach projects. This year we have sent \$1600 to the Congo to assist with sanitation, something we all take for granted.







Mammary cancer occurs in both our beloved cats and dogs. They are in fact the most common neoplasm affecting non-desexed female dogs, but are rare in males. Most mammary cancer is primary, meaning it originates from the glandular tissue or supportive structures rather than spreading there from another location. Tumours can behave in two different ways; benign or malignant. Malignant pertains to those that spread elsewhere in the body, whereas benign grow locally. In dogs, mammary cancer is benign or malignant in roughly equal portions. In cats however, they are normally the nastier malignant type that spreads.

Hormones play a significant role in the formation of these tumours in our pets. One of the major reasons desexing your female dog/cat prior to its first season is because this drastically reduces the risk of mammary neoplasia.

If a lump in your pet's mammary tissue is found, a sample of the cells or a sample of the tissue can be used to provide more information about its nature. The treatment for those that have not already spread elsewhere in the body is surgical removal, with the aim being to completely remove the tumour. Chemo therapy or radiation therapy can also be used, although typically post-operatively. Although radiation therapy is common in women after breast cancer which has been narrowly removed, its efficacy is less established in our pets.

So if you have a female dog or cat, it is important that you check their mammary glands, especially if they were desexed later in life after multiple oestrus cycles. Even keeping an eye on your male dog's mammary tissue is a good idea. If you have any concerns or would like your pet examined, please give the clinic a call. Early diagnosis is the key to a cure.

At 15 Val began her career as a shorthand typist with the War Service Homes and continued to be employed by the Commonwealth Public Service until her marriage on 22 Jan 1966.





September 2019 marks two very special milestones for the Nairne Red Cross Branch. We will be celebrating the formation of the Branch 105 years ago on 11th of September 1914 in response to the outbreak of WW1. It was called the Nairne Red Cross Circle and operated for 5 years throughout the war until hostilities ceased in 1919. The Branch reformed 80 years ago on 27th September 1939 at the outbreak of WW2 and has been in operation continuously since then. Either way you look at it we will be celebrating a birthday, either our 80th or 85th.

That definitely calls for cake. Thanks for your support in helping us reach these milestones. Come and join us and help us create a little history.

'This is a reminder that the Red Cross Mobile Blood Service will be in Mt Barker from 1st to 4th of October 2019.'

One of our very effective programs is the Telecross program.

Telecross is for people who live alone and are at risk of an accident or illness that may go unnoticed. In particular, people who:

- are frail and aged
- have a disability
- are housebound
- are recovering from an illness or accident

Telecross is also available to the carers of people who are eligible for the service. When family and carers are away, or if someone has just returned home after a hospital stay, Telecross can also be used on a temporary basis.

Friendly volunteers make calls each morning, 365 days a year. If the call is not answered, Red Cross will take action to make sure you are OK.

Even if you have visitors during the week, a phone call first thing in the morning can make a difference if an emergency response is required. The calls provide reassurance as well as help to maintain independence.
