The Mt Barker Council is about to release the Nairne and Environs Development Planning Amendment (DPA) on 30th May. What the DPA does is it reviews all zoning and planning within our area and makes suggested changes. Some of the changes are correcting small mistakes in zoning or planning but some are huge changes like rezoning the Chapman's site for retail and

residential. The DPA document is long and detailed, so the residents' association has decided to work through the document and produce a summary of the proposed changes. We will do this so we can make a written submission.

The dates for public consultation and submission are from 30 May to 25 July 2016. We will make our summary available to our members and the wider community and encourage people to make submissions about changes they feel strongly about.

The Council is holding an Information Session on Wednesday 29 June at the Football Club on Sydney Rd Nairne, between the hours of 4 – 7pm. Council staff will be on hand to answer questions but they won't be recording people's comments and views. These must be done in writing by individuals or groups.

I have always believed that local people can often see some unintended consequences of planning and zoning changes. So it is important for as many of us as possible to engage with the DPA process. Even if people only mention one thing in a submission it can have a big impact in creating a better town. The Council pays attention to the submissions and the Residents' Assoc. has had success on many occasions in getting Council to improve or reverse a proposed change. One day we might print that list in the Nairne News.

Nairne sculpture artist Marjjan Beckic

Introducing Nairne's "Star Gate"

"Star Gate", Nairne's new sculpture is complete. "I hope people will interact with it... turn it around, reach through the hole to kiss love ones, shake hands, have their photo taken through it" said the sculpture's creator Marijan Bekic in a recent interview.

Mr Beckic is originally from Croatia but is now a resident of Sydney after two years in Wudinna making the massive granite sculpture called the Australia Farmer. The Nairne sculpture is also made of Wudinna granite and rotates when pushed with some force. It was made as part of the Adelaide Hills International Sculpture Symposium 2016 held at the Cedars in Hahndorf and was funded by the Mt Barker Council.


Mr Beckic spoke about the sculpture and it's making – "It has two sides... one side is life, positive, loving... then there is other side... The more negative side"

Councillor's Commentary...

I would like to thank you for the opportunity to represent the residents of Nairne and Districts as your local elected member. Trevor Corbell has left some big shoes to fill and I am doing my best to follow in his footsteps.

Just a few matters to draw your attention to for this issue, the most important one being the Nairne DPA.

Nairne DPA will be on public consultation from 30 May 2016 to 25 July 2016 and an information session will be held at the Nairne Oval on 29 June between 4-7pm.

A hard copy will be available at Council Chambers and the Library and online from the Council website. The Post Office will have a Brochure format, I **encourage** everyone to get on line and look through the full copy (with maps and detailed information) and if they require clarification of any issues, attend the information session, contact me, one of the other North Ward Councillors or Simon Martin from NDRA. It is extremely important that if you are not happy about any aspect of the Nairne DPA to write a submission. There is no point in complaining afterwards.

In summary the DPA proposes to change planning policy to:

- Reinvigorate the main street by introducing a greater mix of commercial and retail uses including residential infill and redevelopment of the Chapman's and Bush Timbers' sites

- Reduce the extent of the Historic Conservation Overlay to more accurately reflect the historic core of the town

- Replace the Light Industry zone in Nairne West with a new, more flexible Mixed Use zone

- Realign part of the western town boundary to coincide with the 30 Year Plan for Greater Adelaide, incorporating approximately 7.5 ha of rural land into the town boundary and zoning it Residential

- Reduce the minimum allotment size in Rural Living Policy Area 19 from 20,000m² to 8,000m²

My concern is the proposed **realignment** of the western town boundary to incorporate an extra 7.5ha of rural land and rezone it residential. This will require both transport and wastewater infrastructure and impact on the school and local traffic. At the moment there is 60ha of development land available **within** the town boundary to support growth in the area. This is approximately 530 house allotments.

The rural land provides a buffer between Nairne and Littlehampton/Blakiston. This land also has habitat, birds, animals and even the odd kangaroo. Think about why you chose to live in Nairne. It is important to ensure that Nairne maintains its country ambiance and keeps the green band between towns.

The Draft Annual Business Plan for 2016/2017 is now available for public consultation. Copies are available from Council Chambers and online. The plan provides details of Council's proposed services, programs and projects for 2016/17.

A public meeting prior to the Council meeting will take place on 20 June and the final document will be presented to Council for resolution on 4 July 2016.

The document is still subject to further consideration, however the following Nairne related items have been proposed for inclusion in the budget:

Nairne Soldiers Memorial Hall Upgrade – Structural and Electrical \$104,000

Footpath Renewal Program on Main Road (replacing existing northern footpath at the Chapman end)

Nairne Footpath and Landscape upgrade – upgrading the northern footpath and associated landscaping between 57-91 Old Princes Highway - \$350,000

North Road/Bridge Street Intersection Upgrade Design -\$60,000

Main Street Studies – Working with Businesses to activate main streets in Nairne and Mount Barker - \$10,000

Council have now taken responsibility for the **Nairne Soldiers Memorial Hall** and will be undertaking safety upgrades in 2016/17. The future plan is to develop a Community Centre for Nairne and Districts. I would love to hear your ideas of what activities you would like available at a Community Centre, so I may present these to the Hall Committee and Council.

As you would have noticed work has begun at **Old Chapmans**. It has been sold, the developer has engaged an architect and has begun clearing and cleaning up the site. This area is referred to in the Nairne DPA and requires to be rezoned to allow it to be developed. The plan is to have a Foodland/IGA. I believe it would be beneficial to try to arrange a meeting with the owner to advise the residents of their plans. This is on my to do list and I will keep you up to date via my Facebook page.

Adelaide Hills International Sculpture Symposium is now complete and we have a fantastic sculpture coming to Nairne. Throughout the symposium I visited The Cedars, met Marijan Bekic, our sculptor and watched the progress. It was amazing seeing the transformation of a piece of stone into an fabulous work of art. I am looking forward to seeing our sculpture in place and believe it will be a valuable addition to the town. We can expect it to be erected in Mick Murphy Park before Christmas.

Find something that stokes your furnace within (for me it was/is my children) and keep stoking it (focus on your motivation point. Nothing can stop you. Accept yourself, cast aside your fears, stoke the fire within and push ahead. You may not fully achieve your ultimate goal, however show the courage to "Give it a go". You will be a winner. Leave no stone unturned or regret will eat at you for the rest of your life! "What if" is a word that I hear a lot! If only I did this or tried a bit harder? What could you have achieved?

I believe there are no barriers in life: anything is possible! Winston Churchill said: “succuss is not final. Failure is not fatal: it is the courage to continue that counts!” Show the courage to “Give it a go”. Leave no stone unturned. Fight the good fight and whatever the final result you will be the winner. 

New NBN satellite broadband services launch for Mayo

Residents living in regional and difficult to service areas in Mayo can begin to connect to affordable, high-speed broadband with the launch of services on **nbn**'s Sky Muster satellite network.

Today's official launch of **nbn**'s commercial Sky Muster broadband service is welcome news for the estimated 4,631 Mayo homes and businesses that will be eligible to connect to the service and finally be able to access high speed internet.

The new high-speed broadband service is a practical example of the Turnbull Government's plan to successfully transition Australia's economy and to create more jobs.

Offering download speeds of up to 25 Megabits per second (Mbps) and upload speeds of up to 5 Mbps, the Sky Muster service will provide a faster online experience for internet users living in regional, remote and difficult to service areas. Many homes and businesses in Mayo are still dependent on very basic internet access which makes even online banking or emailing difficult. Sky Muster will change all that for thousands of Mayo residents.

The Australian Government has invested \$2 billion in two advanced Ka-band satellites and a network of ground stations that make up the Sky Muster service.

Each service requires a professional installation of a new receiver dish and indoor modem. More than 600 installers have been fully trained and are forecast to reach on average one to two premises per day due to safety considerations and extended traveling times involved in each installation. Equal priority will be given to new customers and current **nbn** Interim Satellite Service users migrating to Sky Muster. Around 5,000 users per month across Australia will be connected in the early months of the rollout before scaling up to 10,000 installations per month later this year.

A variety of different broadband plans are available from providers and pricing compares favourably with current international and local commercial satellite and mobile internet plans.

The launch of **nbn**'s commercial satellite services is delivering the Government's commitment to bring high-speed broadband to rural and regional Australia.






