Fringe Festival Comes to Nairne

Dawdle & Doodle Day puts the ART into pARTicipation.



The Fringe Festival is coming to Nairne and giving you the chance to be the stars.

On Sunday 17 March from 10 am to 4 pm, the Nairne Main Street will be closed to traffic and opened to excitement, as kids of all ages – from 2 to 102 – are encouraged to express themselves with chalk on pavement.

“What you do is up to you,” says Adelaide Hills Marketing Managing Director and Ideas Chick Mikyla Gilbert. “Write a poem, draw a cartoon, create your own masterpiece – the only limit is your imagination. It’s all about getting involved. Art isn’t just something you buy or watch, it’s a part of life that everyone can do.”

The event promises to be an action-packed family day with a number of activities to suit all age groups. Highlights of the day will include performances by the Amazing Drumming Monkeys, thanks to the generous support of Matilda’s Montessori Child Care and Early Learning Centre, as well as performances by the Mount Barker Concert and Big Bands.

Fringe Festival comes to Nairne (cont. from p1.)

A secretive yarn-bombing collective is already hard at work, preparing fresh woolly wonders for the street furniture. There will also be plenty of food and drink available from some of Nairne and surrounds' finest eateries and community groups.

Dawdle & Doodle is a true community event and there are a number of local groups who are already confirmed to be taking part, such as the CFS, Girl Guides, NDRA and Nairne Lions, among many others. Community groups who are not yet involved are invited to contact the event manager Simon Duncan, on 8391 0144, to discuss how they can join in.

Events such as these require the support of not only the community but also some of the businesses behind the community, and Dawdle & Doodle Day is no different. The Fairmont Group, through their Fox Hill Estate, have come on as the Major Sponsor of the event and will be on hand throughout the day with free face painting for the children and other giveaways and competitions for those in attendance.

Established and emerging artists will be in the street getting creative, so come along, be inspired, and produce your own work of street art. "This is a great event for the whole family," says Mikyla Gilbert. "It doesn't matter how old you are, it only matters that you have a go, and our Clown Police will be keeping things nice with their super-soakers."

The District Council of Mount Barker are also proud sponsors of the event, and without their support and encouragement to move this event to Nairne it could not have taken place. "The council is delighted to sponsor such a fabulous event for Nairne," says Mayor Ann Ferguson. "It's a brilliant opportunity for community groups to take part in a major event that will encourage not only locals, but also people from all over the state to rediscover the beautiful town of Nairne."

As well as being Dawdle & Doodle Day, 17 March will also mark the opening of the Nairne Mural & History walk, which will officially be launched at 11 am as part of Dawdle & Doodle Day. This walk will tour groups through Nairne, recalling some of the history of one of the Adelaide Hills' oldest towns, as well as highlighting the murals throughout the town that are part of the recent mural project. As part of this celebration there will be a number of murals being completed live on the day by local artists, which will be taking place on the old netball court between Jeffrey and Cockburn Streets.

"This is the first major event to be held in Nairne for many years, and the first time ever that a Fringe event has been held in the town," says Mikyla Gilbert. "We'd love to see the community get behind it, so this Fringe, don't just talk the talk – chalk the walk!"

She has quite a few cameras (one for every occasion!) and her favourite subjects are to be found within nature. She is a member of the Adelaide Camera Club, and says this keeps her inspired and learning more about photography all the time.

Councillor's commentary...


Hello and welcome to 2013. I hope that for you and those nearest you, it's a good year. Some happenings since the last issue of 'Nairne News', and other things in the pipeline ...

Nairne Township Master Plan approved. Following very comprehensive community consultation, the final version of the NMP was adopted by Council's Strategic Planning & Development Policy Committee (SPDPC) on 11 February. Next steps will include the NMP being looked at by full Council to establish priority actions and to determine what resources will be allocated in the upcoming 2013-14 budget. The SPDPC also noted that a detailed **retail needs analysis** ('Nairne Retail Strategy Direction') is now getting under way to establish clearly what the broader community's wishes are about where Nairne's main retail activity should be. We are already aware of a proposal for a shopping centre at the **western boundary** of the town; another has now been presented for a mixed retail/residential development on the **Chapman's factory** site. But, against those two possibilities, there is a clear message that the Main Road must also be maintained and enhanced as a viable retail and business precinct; that need is recognised in the NMP by, amongst other things, the desirability of **more flexible zoning in the Main Rd** and a new push to get the power lines there put underground. Also featured is the urgent need for a major upgrade of North Rd, and work is already under way to bring that about.

Power line undergrounding? The relocation of power lines underground is determined by the State Government's Power Line Environment Committee (PLEC). Each year, Council is invited to seek funding for new and outstanding projects on a \$2 (Government) to \$1 (Council) basis. Included in a list of seven possible projects for the Mt Barker District, Nairne's Main Rd is identified as one needing early attention. The Government's rezoning of 45ha for new residential development off Saleyard Rd, and Council's action to pursue a Master Plan for Nairne, are cited as reasons for PLEC to again consider Nairne's needs for undergrounding of power lines. It might be expected that a reaction by PLEC will be known over the next several months.

North Rd upgrade. Funds were allocated in the 2012-13 Council budget for a scoping study to determine what needs to be done to upgrade North Rd. The study got under way just before Christmas and will be the subject of a report to Council in the very near future. North Rd is very much in need of improvement but, given the various alignments involved, the placement of Stobie poles and other infrastructure, and close proximity of adjoining properties, etc, an upgrade is not likely to be an easy nor inexpensive task.

Nairne Oval Sports Complex redevelopment. On 21 January, Council received the Nairne Oval Committee's (NOC) proposals on a 5-year program to upgrade the Oval complex. The proposals were contained in an independent report prepared by consultants Suter Planners. Council staff will now be working with the NOC to

identify funding sources for the recommended upgrade, including from the State Government's Office of Recreation & Sport. Consideration will also be given to what Council might contribute in its 2013-14 budget. Considerable amounts have already been raised in the Nairne community (mainly through the Nairne Market) for work already done at the Oval, and it might be anticipated that that support will continue to be forthcoming.

New bus stop facilities. We were advised just before Christmas that, after Council lodged an application with DTI, a bus stop shelter will soon be built on the Old Princes Hwy near the retirement village. This is just one of three sites I had asked for, but it's a start. The generous and ever-resourceful Nairne Lions are also planning to place seats at three bus stops - two on Main Rd and one on Woodside Rd.

Bald Hills Rd/Old Princes Hwy T-junction upgrade. As I have previously advised, DTI do not intend to upgrade this notorious junction in a major way until work gets under way to simultaneously construct a new interchange at the Bald Hills Rd tunnel under the SE Freeway. However, as a result of some lobbying, the Department has acknowledged that some improvements do need to be done at the Bald Hills Rd/OPH junction sooner rather than later. DTI has now undertaken a feasibility study to provide for some interim measures there. Details are yet to be provided to Council, but are likely to include a greater degree of separation between the slip lane to Bald Hills Rd and the main east-west OPH carriageway. It is understood that DTI are now seeking funding for the work to proceed as soon as possible. For its part, Council will be proceeding with an upgrade of Bald Hills Rd between the SE Freeway tunnel and OPH during 2013. This will complement other works now already under way to construct a **roundabout at the Bald Hills/Springs Roads intersection.**

Reduced Woodside Rd speed limit. You need to be aware that the State Department of Transport & Infrastructure (DTI) has reduced the speed limit on Woodside Rd to **50 kph**. The section involved is between Woodside Road's junction with the Old Princes Hwy (OPH) and the Pulleine/North Roads intersection. My original request related to just the shorter section between OPH and the railway crossing - mainly because of the risks there for school children and others getting to and from the school. But DTI determined that, since Woodside Road previously remained the only 60 kph zone within the Nairne town boundaries, it was logical that the limit be reduced over its entire length to Pulleine/North Roads. So, keep that right foot light on the pedal!

Community grants now available. Are you or your community group looking for financial support for a worthy community project? Applications for the second round of 2012-13 Council Community Grants opened on 20 February; the closing date is Friday 22 March. More details and application forms can be found on Council's website: www.dcmtbarker.sa.gov.au.

'Dawdle 'n' Doodle' Day. By the time you read this, you will be aware of this great new event for Nairne, to take place in the Main Road on Sunday 17 March. Details are featured elsewhere in this edition of 'Nairne News'. It's great that we were able to attract this event to Nairne, the first of what should continue as an annual highlight. As an Adelaide Fringe Festival activity, it should bring many visitors to our town. So get out there on March 17, support the many local community groups and businesses involved, let the kids (and yourself?) give vent to inner expressions of artistic flair, and enjoy everything else that the inaugural Nairne Dawdle 'n' Doodle Day has to offer!

Each year, at the Australia Day picnic in Bill Joyce Park, the Lions Club of Nairne & Districts honours a local who has made a significant contribution to our community. This year's recipient of the Lions Club of Nairne & Districts Citizen of the Year Award is our hard-working Councillor, and now Deputy Mayor, Trevor Corbell.

In his younger days, Trevor moved from SA to Canberra and worked his way up through the ranks of Parliament in the Prime Ministers Department, having such jobs as Policy Advisor & Manager of the Ministerial wing of Parliament House. After 30 years of this, he became the Advocacy officer for Diabetes Australia lobbying Ministers to improve the lives of diabetes sufferers. It was in this capacity that he met his wife, Di Franklin, and moved with her to Nairne in 2006. Trevor found a passion for his new home and was elected to the Mt Barker Council in November 2010 with the most personal votes of any councillor elected to North ward that year. Trevor is Council representative on many of our committees, including the NDRA, the Institute, the Oval Committee, the Soldiers Memorial Hall committee, and the RSL; and is a supporter of Mt Barker Girl Guides - who meet in Nairne, and of our own Lions Club. He is also one of the instigators of a new group called Nairne Inc, whose goal is to raise the profile of Nairne in terms of tourism and culture. Trevor was a major instigator of the Nairne Master Plan and he is also currently pushing hard for the expansion of the Nairne Oval Complex. In his spare time Trevor volunteers as a JP at Council. And he thinks he is not doing enough!!!





Things are heating up at Littlehampton Child Care Centre

Animals: Do they feel the pain?

By Catherine Motter, Littlehampton Veterinary Clinic.

In the 1600's, the famous French philosopher Descartes did studies on dogs that included nailing them to walls and studying their response. He concluded that animals did not feel pain, that they were completely mechanistic, that they think machine-like. This concept, that animals are not sentient beings, and are unable to feel pain as we do, has carried on over the centuries and still exists today in many parts of the world.

I have seen patients with bone tumours, in humans considered the most painful of all cancers, still run after a rabbit with great vigour. I once had a client who told me her Jack Russell Terrier had gotten out during a party only to come home again and lie underneath the dining room table; it was only later that she realised that the dog had come home minus a leg. It had been hit by a car, and the wound had not bled because of the mashing of its blood vessels by the weight of the automobile. He appeared bright and alert when he was admitted to my clinic with life threatening trauma.

So how come they didn't cry and carry on like we humans do?

The answer is that dogs are descended from wild species of canines that are pack animals — even that Maltese cross that bears no resemblance to the wolf-like dog that is a close ancestor. Canines that show pain in nature do not survive. Under these conditions, it is survival of the fittest.

In my practice I see the bravery of dogs - their genetic history, that tells them they must go on.

The 10 year old German Shepherd with arthritis, a Kelpie cross with liver disease, and their owners that love these dogs tell me they are not in pain because they don't cry, don't fuss. My solution is to put them on pain medication at the appropriate dose and ask the clients to note any behavioural changes; almost always they report their pet has become more active, acting as it did years before. This is how I diagnose pain.



Families4Families supports people with acquired brain injury



A new family-focussed support group has been established for people with Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) and their family members. The mission of Families4Families ABI Support Network is to assist adults who have acquired brain injury, and their families, to build resilience and maximise quality of life and wellbeing by providing information and education sessions, social opportunities, online resources, and other family-focussed supports.

The Network has been established by people with experience of ABI, thanks to the generous support of the Julia Farr MS McLeod Benevolent Fund, and of the Flinders University which is also undertaking important research on these families and their needs.

This month regular group sessions are commencing in 7 different locations across South Australia and will encompass opportunities for these, often socially isolated, families to connect with others, and also to be provided with leading edge ABI information, education, and systems insights. Group locations include Adelaide, Warradale, and Sellicks Beach, and manager Jennifer Farnden has confirmed that if additional members from the Adelaide Hills join, then the establishment of a Hills group is likely.

Piney Ridge Rd - Preserving Nairne's bushland heritage

Piney Ridge Rd sits at the edge of Nairne's northern boundary. From North Rd, it winds its way up to reveal a backdrop of hills and distant rural views. As you climb higher you can see most of Nairne, Mt Barker summit and Mt Lofty too. But Piney Ridge Rd is significant for another reason. Its roadside is a botanical time capsule. With most of the surrounding area cleared of remnant vegetation, it's quite rare and it's right on our doorstep. About 8 years ago, a 2 km stretch of Piney Ridge Rd became a Bush For Life site. Volunteers, of which I am one, have been working this roadside for all that time, weeding it, nurturing it and, on occasion, worrying about its capacity to survive intact into the future.

I often wonder if the unassuming nature of the vegetation on Piney Ridge is its own worst enemy. To put it bluntly, it's not all that visually spectacular. Much of it is so understated and inconspicuous, that unless you're looking real hard and you know exactly what you're looking for, you can walk right by without even noticing it. It might not be obvious at first glance, but there are over 40 different indigenous plant species that can be found along that small stretch of road. The gums, sheoaks and wattles are the most obvious but there are also the tussocks of dianellas, juncus and lomandras that dot the roadside; the groundcovers such as the matted bush pea, the native cranberry and fanflower that cover the rocky embankments, and in spring, the purple and yellow flowers of the chocolate lilies and bulbines emerge amongst the drifts of kangaroo, wallaby and spear grasses.

In spring, it's much easier to spot and identify plants, grasses and weeds because so much is in flower or has seed heads. That is when we did our last informal site audit. After a couple of years of good rain, we could see a renewal taking place; which goes a long way to restoring a sense of purpose to what we do. We saw things in abundance that we hadn't seen for a few years now. We even found a few plants that we didn't know were on the site. Our very own piece of humble Nairne bushland doesn't shout about its own importance with flashy displays, but Piney Ridge Rd has an important place in our local landscape with a natural plant diversity that's worth recognising and preserving.

Trees For Life is a community organisation that aims to revegetate SA and conserve its remnant vegetation. Our Bush For Life program trains community volunteers in 'bush regeneration' techniques and supports them to care for native vegetation on sites such as this one, ensuring the rich diversity of plants, birds and animals remain and thrive.
