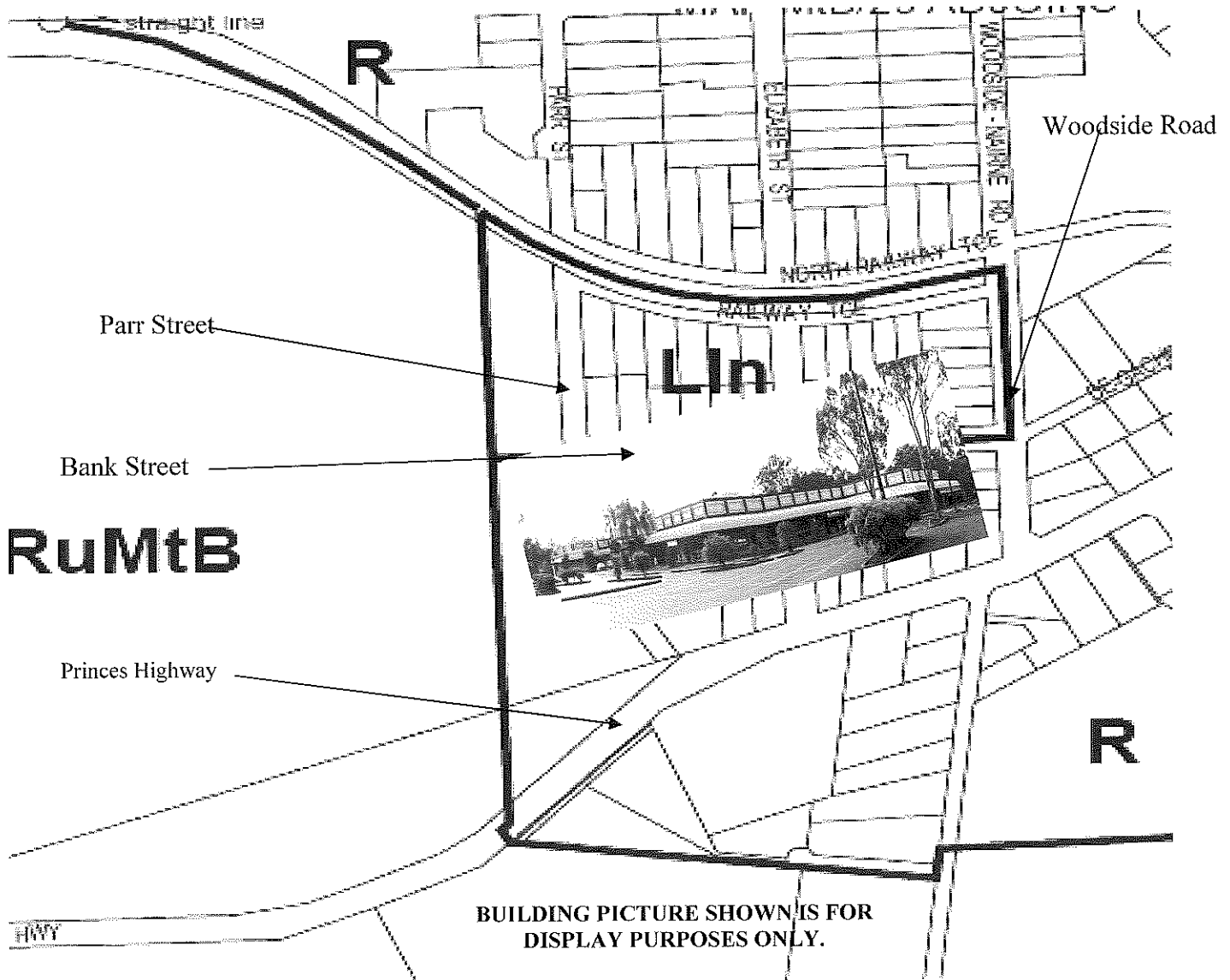

The speakers initiative at bi-monthly meetings is still underway, the meal at Chingari was lovely and the meeting afterwards dealt with ongoing issues in Nairne and the surrounding area. Michael Sheehan spoke at the April meeting and shared local history relating to Adelaide Hills men who fought in the Boar War. It is sobering to hear how little recognition these men and their families received and Michael had some lovely old photographs to show us.

A committee meeting was held in March to cover outstanding issues, notably the issues of insurance and fundraising. We agreed to pursue the usual raffle option and acknowledged the generosity of the usual Nairne sponsors in their ongoing support.

Correspondence to Mt Barker council relating to the possibility of more sensitive tree trimming in the Main St. elicited the response that we are still hoping to underground the power lines as soon as possible and in the meantime the trees need to be trimmed to a standard clearance of the existing lines – so we continue to hope for undergrounding as soon as possible.

Anzac Day Jan Porter has kindly provided a wreath as she regularly does and Clive Pay will attend laying of same at the service.

I was contacted re comments for development of a trail between Mt Barker, Littlehampton and Nairne. Jo-Anne Sarre responded with comments & I sent this on behalf of both InkPot and NDRA. It will be interesting to follow this development and we are pleased to have the opportunity to participate in its planning, comments on this are welcome and I will be happy to coordinate them and pass on as opportunity arises.

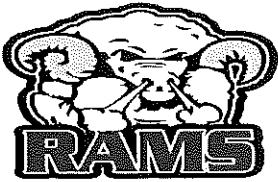

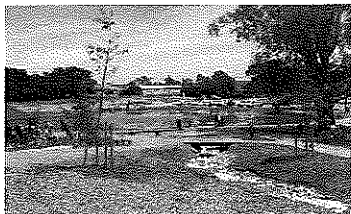

DEVELOPMENT PLANS SUBMITTED FOR RETAIL SHOPPING/PRECINCT.

As most of you would have read recently in the Courier Newspaper 3rd March, plans are underway for Nairne to have a new “Shopping Centre / Retail development”.

A local developer “is in the early stages of a getting a retail plan amendment report to see whether or not this is what the community wants”. This new development is planned for the land situated between Railway Terrace, Bank Street, Parr Street and Woodside Road which is currently zoned as Light Industry and Residential. This land is the same area that the Nairne Community so strongly voted NO to an Industrial site in recent years.

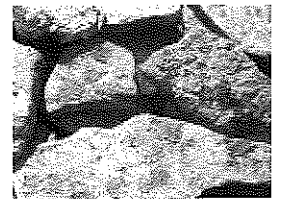
You may also have read the article on 17th March from David Smart (Nairne Traders President) in reply to the above development. David makes note “that we do not need development away from the Main street”.

On Tuesday 20th April I was invited to attend (as editor) a Nairne Traders meeting to discuss this development. At this meeting 16 people attended. There was a lot of discussion on whether it was a good idea or not. Some were not against having a supermarket in Nairne but felt it would be of more benefit to the current main street traders to have it built in the main street, perhaps at the old Chapmans site or behind the current Laundromat. Some present felt it would be good for the township to help it keep its own identity and not a “sleeper town” as noted in one of the articles. David Smart spoke on the fact that the DC Mt. Barker needs to help out the current Main street traders who have for many years, been pro-active about retaining the heritage of the main street. “The Mt. Barker Council have promised a lot to Nairne over the years (in which the traders have given money to) in which nothing has been done”.

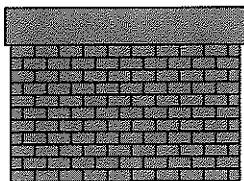
As part of the development application, community consultation must occur. Hopefully soon we will have more information available to look at over the next couple of months. Written by Lyssa Liebelt



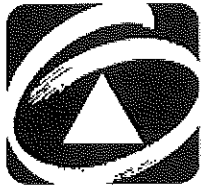

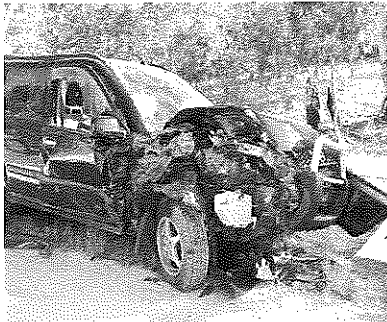
The volunteers that currently make up the Nairne & Districts Country Fire Service are a very dedicated group.

This dedication is shown by the many hours put in by members. Hours not only put in on incidents they respond to but also the required training.

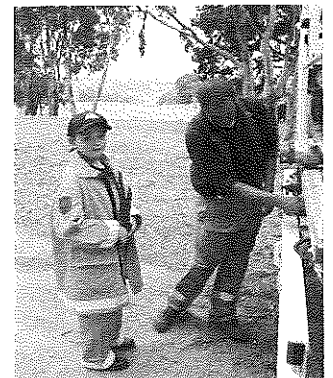
The Nairne brigade is currently looking for new members that are able to respond during the day ie: shift workers or people that work in the local area. As a volunteer in the C.F.S. there is a minimum training requirement that all new members must meet to be able to respond on the appliances (fire trucks). This is the Basic Fire Fighter course. Right & left: When cars collide. Two cars approaching each other on a very narrow dirt road, did not have as much room to pass each other as they thought they did.

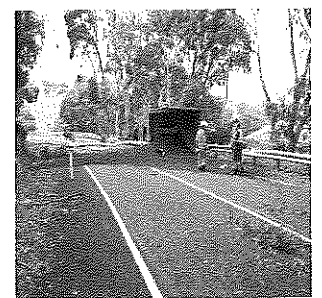

ANZAC DAY 2010 NAIRNE

This years Anzac Day commenced for the R.S.L. Club members with the Balhannah Scout Group who stayed overnight at the Nairne Soldiers Memorial Hall. The Scouts stay here overnight and were given a presentation from the President about the origin and importance of Anzac Day. This was followed by a Leader who also gave a presentation and showed the Scouts a set of field glasses about 90 years old from WW1. The Dawn Service was attended by over 300 local residents on a perfect day. The service commenced with the playing of Bag Pipes from 6am from a member of the the Mount Barker Caledonian Society prior to the main services starting at 6.15am with the mounting of the Catafalque Party. Unfortunately this year the Cadets nor the Regular Army were able to supply staff to mount the traditional four soldier party. Instead a club member who is a member of the Light Horse Society mounted the Catafalque dressed in original uniform complete with side arms. The local Mayor, Ann Ferguson was invited by the Club President to give an opening speech. This was followed by readings from the presiding Reverent, Hymns accompanied by members of the Adelaide Hills Family Church and a reading of "In Flanders Field". Four girls from the Mount Barker Girl Guides read this poem. Two of the girls read a line each from the poem which was then sang quietly in an echo by the other two girls until the poem was completed. This was a chilling presentation that I'm sure would have brought a secret tear to many during the playing of the Last Post. The Service was concluded and then followed by a Gunfire Breakfast kindly catered for by the Nairne Lions Club who donate their time and food for everybody to enjoy.

The attendance at the Dawn Service is growing larger every year. We have a lot more children attending and it is reassuring to see that our history remains as important today as it ever has been. Although the Nairne Sub-Branch of the R.S.L. is only a small club we take great pleasure in bringing the Dawn Service to the Memorial. This would not be possible without support from the following people; Nairne C.F.S., Nairne Post Office, Adelaide Hills Family Church, Mount Barker Girl Guides, Mount Barker District Council, Balhannah Scout Group, Mount Barker Caledonian Society, Nairne Institute, Nairne Red Cross and the Nairne Lions Club. We would like to thank all those involved but most importantly the residents of Nairne for attending the 2010 Anzac Day Dawn Service.

In 2009, at the end of year 12, Sarah Heyer (pictured left) was awarded the Zonta Young Women in Public Affairs Award (YWPA): "For consistent effort; leadership and initiative; volunteer service in the community; interest in the status of women and international affairs." YWPA had a further optional application to go on to the next level. Sarah chose to continue and completed the application which included essay questions and a morning tea at which she made an oral presentation. Sarah won the second level and her application has hence been passed on for assessment at the next two levels (national and international), of which she will find out the results in July.

The essay questions involved talking about the following:

- School community contributions.
- Scouting involvement and community and volunteer work.
- Sarah's personal international awareness (Student International Scout Exchange Program [SISEP] to Denmark 2007-08).

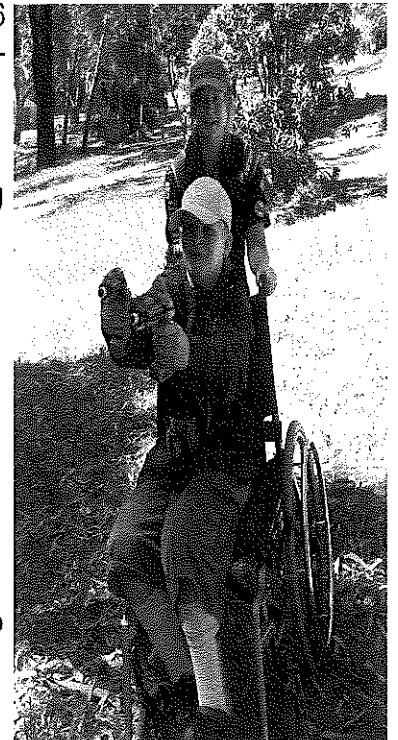
- Her views on the issues in Australia that are limiting the status of women: Sarah wrote about the difference between men's and women's sports in terms of

broadcasting, promotion, sponsorship, etc. "My views on issues worldwide that are limiting the status of women". Sarah wrote about the sexual and reproductive rights of women.

In the morning tea speech she spoke about her school, Scouting and community involvements as well as telling a little bit about her prospective future: Sarah is currently studying a Bachelor of Tourism and Event Management at UniSA; She is currently a Joey Scout leader at Mount Lofty Scout group and is currently a Rover at Flash Rovers.

At a recent meeting of the Zonta club, Sarah presented herself and made another speech including the above information as well as the issues she addressed in her written application. Zonta' YWPA is an award with the goals of encouraging young women to participate in public and political life by recognizing young women's (16-20y.o) commitment to the volunteer sector, evidence of volunteer leadership achievements and a dedication to the advancement of the status of women

"It is also a great chance for the boy's family to have a week's respite (as they are not on the camp)".

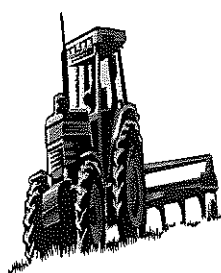
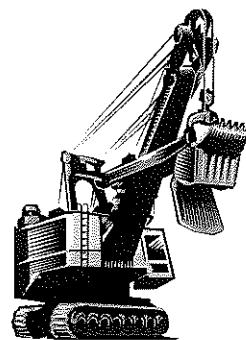
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A SPIRITUAL GLIMPSE 2010

The Spirituality in the Pub celebrates its 10th year of operation in 2010. The program for this special year deliberately involves young people, a wish expressed among supporters in the evaluation exercise conducted at the end of 2009.

The opening event on the 2nd March, for example, featured Darryn Keneally Director of In 2 Life and Justin Monaghan, the coordinator of the Christian Surfers Association, both young and enthusiastic. Their topic was "Mentoring with the Spirit". Darryn's organization addresses the concerns of youth, whether it is drug addiction, unwanted pregnancies, jail internment, but it plays a positive role in introducing the Youth Awards by Channel 9.

Wedded to Justin's love of surfing is his interest in chatting with fellow surfers about Christianity. The principle behind mentoring is to give information and advice to people who seek it not to try to assist those who the mentor may think should be interested. Darryn then is available to young people in danger of making a mistake or who are all ready in trouble. He takes a more active role as well by searching for people who are contributing positively to the youth culture in general so that their efforts may be publicly recognized.

Justin's success with the young beach lover is that he is recognized as someone who is prepared to listen to their interest in Christianity, to chat about their life direction whether it be in the surfers' clubrooms, while they both might wait patiently for 'the' wave, or simply doodle idly in the sand together.

Accompanying the young Director of the SA Museum Dr. Suzanne Miller on Tuesday 6 April is Len Altman, winner of the Prime Minister's Award (\$50,000) for Excellence in Teaching. Len has the honor of being mentioned in the House for informing the Prime Minister of exciting developments in science teaching throughout Australian schools today. He is a former adviser to the Education Department in Aboriginal secondary education and is presently Senior Science Master at Marden College. He will talk about his dreams for his science students while Suzanne will reveal her dreams for the Museum.

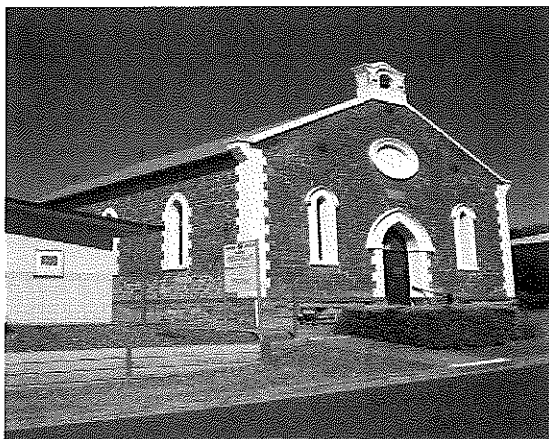
The Community Spirit is the theme for the meeting on Tuesday 4th May. With his vast experience as a volunteer and as CEO of Emergency Services over many years including leading the Government inquiry into the West Coast fires one could hardly list Vince Motorola in the youth category however partnering him on the night is Joel Dignam, a young engineering student who was the only South Australian member chosen to be in the 21 member Australian youth contingent to attend the Climate conference at Copenhagen.

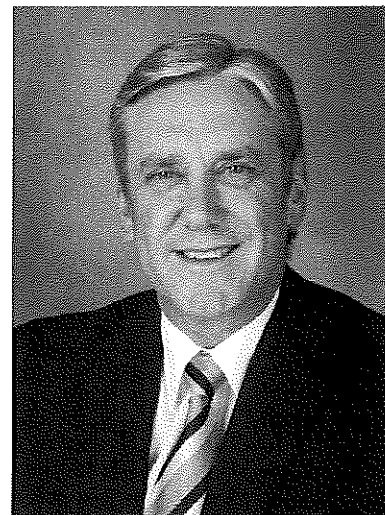

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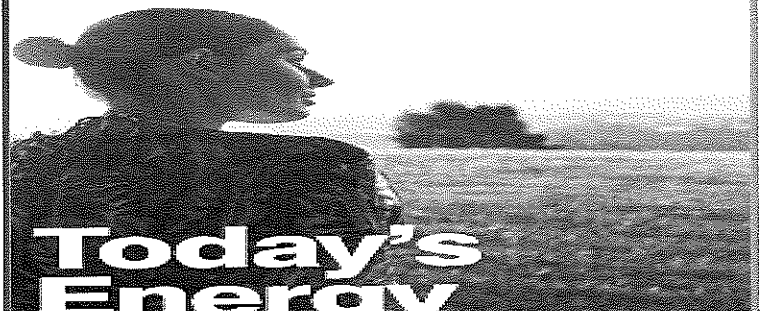
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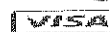

Hire Company thefts
